## A FRIENDLY REMINDER

## **OFF SEASON IS OVER!**

## WELCOME BACK CAMPERS, IN-SEASON IS HERE.

#### What does that mean?

30&60 day pads?

- 30 day pads: you move your camper every 30 days: it must be moved to a different campground, for at least 4 days, then you can move back, but you cannot occupy the same pad location you were previously on.
- 60 day pads: You move your camper every 60 days(60 day sites are marked by the electric box being orange): it must be moved to a different campground, for at least 4 days, then you can move back, but you cannot occupy the same pad location you were previously on.

- If you need to head home for a few days and don't want to put your camper away, you can leave it out unoccupied for 5 days (ex. if you leave on Sunday, you must be back by Friday before midnight. If you are going to be gone longer than the allotted 5 days, you must put your camper away or take it with you.
- During this time, unplug is NOT in effect, so you can leave your camper plugged in when taking leave.
- Going over your 30 free days?
   It is \$10.67 a day after those 30 free days



## **Chicken Dressing**

From Larri Daugherty

### Ingredients:

- 4-5 boneless/skinless chicken breast
- 4-5 loafs of bread
- 1 box of chicken broth
- 3 eggs
- 1 onion
- 1 stock of celery
- 5 TLBS of ground sage
- salt/pepper to taste
- -Boil chicken breast in broth, add water as needed (shred when done)
- -Chop and cook celery and onion in a saucepan, just cover with water or stock (do NOT drain)
- -Tear up bread in a large bowl

Add eggs, cooked onion and celery (water also), shredded chicken, salt and pepper to taste, 5 TLBS of ground sage

- -Mix well (should be kind of sticky, if not add more bread)
- -Bake in a greased 9x13 cake pan until done
- -350 degrees for about 2-2.5 hours (depending on thickness)




